What is Disability Management & Return to Work?

Disability management and return to work practitioners utilize an empathetic approach to help people in vulnerable situations. They work collaboratively with management, unions or employee organizations, insurance providers, government agencies, health care providers and others to assist a worker who has incurred a mental or physical health injury or illness and are at risk of losing their employment.

Because disability management is a complex field, successful practitioners will have combined skills and knowledge in the areas of:

- Disability management theory and practice
- Legislation and benefit programs
- Labour-management relations
- Communication and problem-solving skills
- Disability case management

- Return-to-work coordination
- Health, psychosocial, prevention and functional aspects of disability
- · Program management and evaluation activities
- Ethical and professional conduct

Career Opportunities

There is currently a shortage of qualified, competent and certified disability management practitioners due to the increasing focus on better return to work outcomes by many organizations across all sectors and is related to the aging workforce, increasing disability costs, incidences of mental health impairments and return to work obligations. Prospective places of employment include:

- Employers
- Unions
- Government

- Insurance companies
- Workers compensation organizations
- Service providers
- Human resources departments

Employees responsible for disability management may also have other responsibilities including the related areas of human resources and occupational health and safety. The salary range of disability management professionals starts at around \$55,000, and more senior levels can expect to be paid up to and well over \$100,000 per year.

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DISABILITY MANAGEMENT PRACTITIONER CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

The Disability Management Practitioner Certificate Program at PCU-WHS covers the breadth of skills and knowledge required by disability management and return to work practitioners. Each course is led by an instructor with expertise in the topic area and most instructors continue to practice as well as teach in the area of disability management and return to work.
