

Course Loads - Policy 050

Policy Statement

The University may limit the number of courses undertaken by a student.

Unless otherwise defined by a program, a full course load for an undergraduate student is normally between nine (9) and twelve (12) credits per trimester. Students are encouraged to enroll in not more than four (4) courses per trimester. Students may not enroll in more than five (5) courses per trimester without prior permission.

Definitions

Procedures

The University Calendar will advise students of the policy.

Students will be advised that they may not enroll in more than six (6) courses per semester without prior consultation with Student Services r and written permission of the program head.

A student may appeal a course load related decision as outlined in the University's policy on Academic Complaint and Appeal.
