Appointment of Registrar and Director of Continuing Education and Student Services

Pacific Coast University for Workplace Health Sciences is pleased to announce the appointment of Bryce Casavant, DSocSci, as Registrar and Director of Continuing Education and Student Services.

Dr. Bryce Casavant holds a Master of Arts in Interdisciplinary Studies and a Doctor of Social Sciences degree, both completed through Royal Roads University. He also held fellowship with the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada during his doctoral research project, "In Search of a Wild Peace", where he investigated regulatory and union relation issues pertaining to special provincial constables.

For twenty years Dr. Casavant has provided cutting edge expertise to federal and provincial governments in areas of regulatory compliance and policy development. He has presented in all levels of court and has produced over fifty technical and opinion publications on law enforcement and environmental affairs. He actively lectures in the field of union relations and research methods, and has been called upon to provide submissions to the BC Legislature.

As PCU-WHS Registrar, Dr. Casavant maintains a wide array of pan-institutional relationships through higher education. He also continues to lecture and teach at Royal Roads University and studies law part-time with Robert Gordon University of Scotland.

Dr. Casavant is a Canadian forces veteran who served in Afghanistan and later worked for the Province of BC as a provincial fish and wildlife officer/conservation officer. He has an active research interest in military and law enforcement policy frameworks for injured veterans and their families.
